Canterbury Park is truly a unique summer racing destination. This agreement has reinvigorated Canterbury Park's horsemen and helps us to offer a nationally competitive purse structure. The staff and management of Canterbury Park aren't the only ones who are excited about the upcoming meet. 

The Racing Office will be closed on Mondays & Tuesdays except the days which we enter. The Racing Office will open at 8:00am on entry days and **entries will close at 10:30am**.

Scratch Policy

All scratches at Canterbury Park may only be done by permission of the stewards. Fields can scratch down to 10 without penalty.

Eligibility

Horses 14 years of age and older are ineligible to race at Canterbury Park.

Turf Policies

Queens Plates, Queens Plates XT's, World Plates and Thoroughbred Race Plates with the Toe Grabs completely **ground flush** are the only shoes allowed on the turf course. No Level Grips, no Rims, no Stickers, no Turn-Downs and no Block Heels.

If management considers it inadvisable for any reason not to run a scheduled turf race on the turf course, it will be run on the main track at the following distances:

Original Turf Distance	On the Main Track
5 Furlongs	5 Furlongs
7.5 Furlongs	**1 Mile**
1 Mile	1 Mile
1 Mile 70 Yards	1 Mile 70 Yards
1 Mile and 1/16	1 Mile and 1/16
1 Mile and 3/8	1 Mile and 1/4

^{**} Two-year-old turf races carded at 7.5 furlongs will be run at 6.5 furlongs on the main track if management considers it inadvisable to run on the turf.

Preference Date System

- 1. Preference dates will not supersede conditions of a race.
- 2. Horses will not be eligible to receive a date until their foal papers are on file in the Racing Office.
- 3. All horses registered prior to 4:00pm, <u>Monday, May 12, 2014</u> will receive a zero which is the lowest possible date. A horse keeps a zero until he/she runs or scratches or the papers are removed from the Racing Office.
- 4. All horses registering after Monday, May 12 will receive an "R" date corresponding to the racing day of the meeting when registered.
- 5. Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance with the exception of stakes and trials. Horses starting in stake races and trials will retain their previous date.
- 6. A zero has first preference.
- 7. Horses without papers on file in the Racing Office will receive last preference.
- 8. Horses that run will receive a preference date corresponding to the date they race and lose all dates previously held. Should a horse be registered, or come off a list on a non-racing day, the next racing day will be used as the preference date.
- 9. When a turf race is removed from the turf, all horses that run on the main track retain their previously held preference date.
- 10. Horses which scratch or are scratched will keep their preference as if they had run. Parts of entries that scratch will receive the date of the scratch as their running date.
- 11. In an effort to ensure that racing fans will have an opportunity to wager on a reasonable number of horses, the following policies are in place concerning turf entries:

Entries will be accepted in turf races (excluding stakes) for Main Track Only horses (main track only entries). Trainers must declare MTO at time of entry. A MTO entry has no preference to draw into a turf race as a starter and will be carded as an also-eligible at all times even if the race doesn't overfill. A maximum of two MTO entries will be drawn as also eligibles in overfilled turf races.

In overfilled turf races, the also-eligible list shall be comprised of first, turf preferred entries then MTO entries. If the race is removed from the turf, MTO also-eligibles will have first preference to draw into the race in order of their date preference. If the race remains on the turf, MTO entries, regardless of whether the race is overfilled or not, will not be eligible to start.

When a race is removed from the turf, MTO horses will receive a date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, MTO horses will retain their previous date.

Scratch time for turf is 10:30am the day of the race. Fields can scratch down to 10 runners without penalty. All scratches will be considered by the stewards.

- 12. All horses placed on the Stewards', Veterinarian's or Starter's list will be posted in the office. They will not be permitted to enter until they have been approved to start. A horse <u>which ran</u> before going on a list will keep its running date. Horses which were <u>scratched</u> will be given a running date of the day the horse comes off the list.
- 13. Horses which have established a date at the current meeting will lose their preference should their papers be withdrawn from the Racing Office or demonstrate intent to race elsewhere and must reestablish a preference date at this meeting.
- 14. In no way does the claiming, ownership transfer or trainer transfer of a horse affect the preference date.
- 15. When a horse's name appears in a race other than a stake or trial and is entered for the following day, such an entry will be given no consideration should the race in which it is entered overfill.
- 16. A preference list will be posted daily and is considered official unless claim of error is made by horsemen.
- 17. It is the responsibility of a person making an entry to claim preference at time of entry. The stewards will consider no claims that do not comply with the above regulations.

Entry Rules

Horses penalized in a race shall not be entitled to any of the allowances in such a race. Horses not entitled to first allowance in a race are not entitled to the second, and if not to the second, then to no subsequent allowances.

Owners and trainers must be careful to claim allowances at the time of entry as well as state penalties and are solely responsible if a horse starts with the wrong weight thereby causing a disqualification.

Management, through contractual agreement with the Minnesota HBPA, reserves the right to call off any overnight race with less than eight interests.

Canterbury Park reserves the right to cancel any stake or other race prior to the actual running thereof - without liability - except for the return of nomination and entry fees paid.

All ownerships in a horse shall be filed with the Racing Secretary before the horse shall start as also shall every change of ownership thereafter during the meeting.

Horses without papers on file in the Racing Office will not be given consideration for preference.

No more than two horses of the same interest shall be entered in any purse or overnight event.

Preference must be declared at the time of entry for entries that involve different ownership and have the same trainer.

The second half of a trainer entry with a different owner has the same preference as a single owner entry.

Trainers are responsible for declaring same owner and separate owner entries at the time of entry.

In all races, winners are preferred, except where conditions of the race state otherwise. Maidens entered in winner's race must be declared a maiden at the time of entry.

Uncoupled Entries

All horses owned wholly or in part by the same person, or his or her spouse, shall be coupled and run as an entry. However, the association may uncouple entries in any race with the permission of the stewards.

In stake races, high weights will be preferred, winners preferred. Sex allowance in races with male horses considered. Horses not drawing a starting position in the gate will receive a refund of entry fee.

Allowance Optional Claiming Races

In specified Allowance/Optional Claiming races, horses may be entered if they are eligible for the allowance condition, or for the specified Claiming Price. In the conditions, the clause "...Races Not Considered" shall apply both to eligibility and allowances.

Naming of Jockeys

Any authorized person entering a horse in any given race shall at the time of making such an entry name the jockey for said horse.

Trainers must have an apprentice jockey engaged before claiming the apprentice allowance.

Apprentice allowances waived at the draw cannot be reclaimed.

Should a jockey remain unnamed at the time of the drawing of entries, the Stewards or their appointees shall select one. No jockey, once named, shall be changed except for good cause by the Stewards.

Jockeys having engagements to ride must be in the scale room one hour before post time. After making weights, jockeys must not leave the jockey room until all engagements for the day have been filled.

Jockeys are positively forbidden in the betting enclosure from one hour prior to post time for the first race. Those who violate this rule may be fined, suspended or ruled off.

Any jockey taken off mounts due to illness or injury is not eligible to be named on horses until approved by the Track Paramedic to the Stewards.

A jockey engaged to ride any horse is bound to fulfill his/her engagement unless excused by the Stewards. Should a rider become injured or ill on the way to the post or at the gate and the Stewards designate a substitute rider, such rider will fulfill the order of the Stewards and complete the engagement on the horse.

Winners Preferred

In all races written for winners, including stakes races, winners shall be preferred. Races written for lifetime conditions, such as non-winners of three or four races, multiple winners shall be preferred.

Transfer of Horse on the Grounds

The purchase, claim or transfer of any horse on the grounds at Canterbury Park - whether by private sale, claiming, or public auction - does not guarantee the new owner of a stall for such horse. The management of Canterbury Park reserves the right to allocate stalls.

Horses will be permitted to start only upon producing a certificate of registration from the Jockey Club showing colors and markings to correspond and having the necessary lip tattoo.

All horses coming to the track must have listed on their Jockey Club registration certificate all transfers of ownerships. No horse will be permitted to start without such accurate and complete record. The cooperation of horsemen will be appreciated. The rule is for your protection. Be sure your papers are up-to-date.

Minnesota-bred Conditions and Claiming Prices

In allowance races that are written for N2X MCS or N3X MCS or state bred; state bred wins will not count for eligibility. Additionally, in open company claiming races, Minnesota-breds will enter for a higher claiming price. For example:

Additionally, races restricted to Minnesota-breds will be contested for the higher claiming price. For example, in an open company \$6,250 N2L, Minnesota-breds will carry a \$10,000 claiming price. When this race type is restricted to Minnestota-breds, all entrants will run for a claiming price of \$10,000.

Workout Rules

- 1. A horse which has not started for a period of 45 days or more shall not be eligible to start until it has completed one timed workout <u>no less than 48 hours</u> prior to the race in which it is entered. Any day of entry workout following the entry of a horse shall appear on the official daily racing program or shall be posted for the public.
- 2. A horse which has not started for a period of 60 days or more shall not be eligible to start until it has completed two timed workouts <u>no less than 48 hours</u> prior to the race in which it is entered.
- 3. A horse, other than a first-time starter, which has not started for a period of one year or more shall not be eligible to start until it has completed three timed workouts, at least one of which must be before a commission veterinarian not less than 48 hours prior to the race in which it is entered. (As a general policy, the Commission Veterinarians ask that these horses work no less than five furlongs).
- 4. First-time starters must have gate approval and a minimum of two timed workouts, one of which must be out of the gate within 60 days prior to the race in which it is entered.
- 5. All workouts required by the commission veterinarian for the purpose of potentially removing a horse from the veterinarian's list must be conducted under the same medication requirements as those for race days.
- 6. All quarter horses racing 870 yards for the first time must have a recorded workout of at least 660 yards before they will be approved to run.

Canterbury Park Condition Book #1 Note Page

Canterbury Park Anti-Slaughter Policy

Canterbury Park requires its racing participants to adhere to its anti-slaughter policy. The policy states:

Any owner or trainer stabled at Canterbury Park who knowingly, or without conducting proper due diligence, sells a horse for slaughter, directly or indirectly, will have his or her stalls permanently revoked from Canterbury Park. Canterbury Park requires its owners and trainers to conduct due diligence on those buying horses and encourages its owners and trainers to support rescue and adoption efforts and to find humane ways of dealing with horses unable to continue racing.

Canterbury Park Stakes Race Information

The Rules and Regulations of racing adopted by the Minnesota Racing Commission govern all races run over the Canterbury Park course. Nominations to stakes are received only with the understanding that the officers of this Association reserve the right to refuse the nomination or the acceptance of a transfer of any nomination will be received except upon this condition.

All disputes, claims and objections arising out of the racing or with respect to the interpretation of the conditions of any stake shall be decided by the stewards of the Association or those whom they may appoint - and their decision upon all points shall be final.

Canterbury Park reserves the right to cancel any stake or other race prior to the actual running thereof - without liability - except for the return of nomination and entry fees paid.

If management considers it inadvisable for any reason to run a scheduled turf race on the turf course, it will be run at corresponding distance on the main track as outlined in this Condition Book under the subsection entitled Turf Policies.

Winner or non-winner of a stated sum means winner or non-winner of a single race of that value to first horse.

Canterbury Park reserves the right to reject any nominations, to reduce the amount of added money, or to cancel any stake at any time prior to the running thereof - without liability - except for the return of the nomination and entry fees.

It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated against EHV-1 before entering the grounds. Additionally, Canterbury Park reserves the right to mandate any vaccine(s) as a condition of admittance based on pandemic or outbreak. For more information on shipping in, please reference Notice for Horsemen Racing/Shipping from Off Grounds and the 2014 Stall Application.

Quarter Horse Stakes Race Information

Checks that are stamped non-sufficient funds will automatically cancel eligibility to the race. Horses dropped from the race for non-sufficient funds will not be eligible for late payments or supplemental nominations. Checks returned for any other reason may also cancel eligibility.

Notice for Horsemen Approved for Stalls

All horses coming through the stable gate, including stable ponies must have:

- 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) signed by a veterinarian that dates within 10 days of entry.
- A Coggins test dated within the past 12 months prior to September 13, 2014.The results for each horse much be clearly marked on the CVI and must be legible and accurate.
- 3. Horses with a CVI originating from a state with recorded active cases of Equine Piroplasmosis (EP) must have a negative test for Babesia (Theileria) equi and Babesia caballi taken within the past 12 months prior to September 13, 2014. Currently this includes only Texas but trainers and owners are encouraged to check the Minnesota Racing Commission website (www.mrc.state.us) for additional states with an active status.

It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated against influenza, strangles and EHV-1. Additionally, Canterbury Park reserves the right to mandate any vaccine(s) as a condition of admittance based on pandemic or outbreak.

No horse will be allowed to enter the grounds, to enter a race or be permitted to start unless a current, valid health certificate covering said horse is presented at the stable gate.

It is current if it is dated not more than ten days prior to the date the horse described in the certificate arrives in Minnesota for the first time in a calendar year. Valid health certificates on all horses arriving at Canterbury Park must be presented at the gate upon arrival or horses will not be permitted to unload.

Being granted stall space at Canterbury Park is a privilege. Along with that privilege comes and expectation that horses based at Canterbury Park will also race at Canterbury Park at a reasonable rate of participation. Owners and trainers that have been granted stall space will be monitored for their general level of participation and future stall allocations may be positively or negatively impacted by these results. Should their be any questions as to the expectations for participation of horses based at Canterbury Park, please contact Eric Halstrom at (952)-233-4829.

Notice for Horsemen Racing/Shipping from Off Grounds

- 1. All horses stabled off grounds must arrive by 9:00 a.m. the date of the race at Canterbury Park.
- 2. Only licensed personnel are allowed in the Test Barn. Your employees must have their MRC license in their possession.
- 3. If your horse is to be treated with Furosemide, you may get a schedule of Furosemide times from the Veterinarian office.
- 4. Horses shipping in from the farm will need to contact the Veterinarians' Office for additional information regarding their Health Certificates (CVI).

Minnesota Racing Commission Medication Rules

The purpose of these rules is to protect the integrity of horse racing, to guard the health of the horse, to cooperate in the establishment of a national medication rules as proposed by the Association of Racing Commissioners International, and to safeguard the interests of the public and the racing participants through the prohibition or control of all substances foreign to the natural horse.

All horses participating in racing at Canterbury Park must be in compliance with the Minnesota Racing Commission Rules relating to medication. Information regarding the Minnesota's medication thresholds can be obtained within this Condition Book under the subsection entitled Minnesota Racing Commission Medication Thresholds, by visiting www.mrc.state.mn.us or in a Trainer's Manual. Explanations of medication rules can be obtained from the Commission Vetertinarians' Office, the HBPA Office or the Steward's Office.

Trainers must notify the Commission Veterinarian's Office of the stall location of each horse that is to be treated with Furosemide. An attendant must be present at the time of administration. Violation of this rule can result in the horse being scratched and the trainer/assistant trainer fined.

All workouts required by the commission veterinarian for the purpose of potentially removing a horse from the veterinarian's list must be conducted under the same medication requirements as those for race days. Due to these requirements, the horse will be tested.

Racing Soundness Exam & Other Inspections

Each and every horse entered to race shall be subjected to a racing soundness exam on race day that shall be conducted by an official veterinarian. All racing soundness exams shall be conducted outside the stall to which the animal is assigned. The Commission Veterinarian shall keep or cause to be kept a continuing health and racing soundness record of each horse so examined.

Additionally, the Horse Identifier and the Horseshoe Inspector shall examine each horse. No horse shall be eligible to start in a race and shall be scratched by the Stewards if it is found unfit to race, not properly identified or improperly shod.

Testing

The Commission Stewards or Commission Veterinarian may require any horse entered to submit to any blood or other pre-race test, and no horse is eligible to start in a race until the owner or trainer complies with any required testing procedure. Blood and urine test samples will be taken from the winner and second place horse from every race and any other horse or horses selected at the discretion of the Stewards.

Milkshaking

The practice of milkshaking horses entered to compete in horse races at Canterbury Park is prohibited. The Minnesota Racing Commission reserves the right to perform physiological tests consisting of blood samples on any horse entered to race prior to racing at Canterbury Park and testing of these samples for total carbon dioxide concentrations. More specific information regarding milkshaking can be found in the Trainer's Manual available from the Chief Veterinarian's Office.

Minnesota Racing Commission Medication Thresholds

No medications other than those listed below or found in Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7890.0100, subp. 13, A through D, shall be allowed in the test sample of a horse. Levels on the following medications shall not exceed:

Minnesota Racing Commission NSAID Rule

According to Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7890.0100 Subp. 13: Medication. "Medication" is a substance, compound, or element, or combination thereof, which is or can be administered to a horse for the purpose of preventing, curing, or alleviating the effects of any disease, condition, ailment, or infirmity, or symptom thereof, or for altering in any way the behavior, attitude, temperament, or performance of a horse, including athletic performance. The term medication includes all analgesics, anesthetics, depressants, narcotics, stimulants, tranquilizers, and other classifications of medications. Nothing herein shall be deemed to include:

A. Non-Steroidal Anti-Inflammatory Drugs (NSAIDS)

The use of one of the three approved NSAIDS shall be permitted under the following conditions, with the exception of two-year-old race horses where no concentration of any NSAID, other than bute, are allowed in the plasma or serum sample taken after racing:

- (a) Bute, provided that the test sample does not contain more than **two (2)** micrograms of the substance or metabolite(s) thereof per milliliter of blood plasma or serum;
- (b) Flunixin, provided that the test sample does not contain more than twenty (20) nanograms of the substance or metabolite(s) thereof per milliliter of blood plasma or serum; and
- (c) Ketoprofen, provided that the test sample does not contain more than ten (10) nanograms of the substance or metabolite(s) thereof per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.
- (2) These or any other NSAIDs are prohibited to be administered within the 24 hours before post time for the race in which the horse is entered.
- (3) The presence of more than one of the three approved NSAIDS, with the exception of Phenylbutazone in a concentration below 0.5 micrograms per milliliter of serum or plasma or any unapproved NSAID in the post-race serum or plasma sample, is not permitted. The use of all but one of the approved NSAIDS shall be discontinued at least 48 hours before the post time for the race in which the horse is entered.
- (4) Any horse to which a NSAID has been administered shall be subject to having a blood and/or urine sample(s) taken at the direction of the official veterinarian to determine the quantitative NSAID level(s) and/or the presence of other drugs which may be present in the blood or urine sample(s).

Drug Testing in Listed and Graded Races

All listed and graded races contested for thoroughbreds at Canterbury Park will be subject to the testing guidelines prescribed for such races by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and the American Graded Stakes Committee.

In 2014, the following races will be contested under these guidelines:

Lady Canterbury Stakes

Canterbury Park Safety Rules

In accordance with Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7897.0100, subp. 16: No person shall ride a horse while on the grounds of an association without a properly fastened protective riding helmet. All jockeys and exercise riders must wear approved safety helmets and safety vests; the weight of which shall not be included in a jockey's weight.

Safety Helmet Guidelines

Per ARCI Model Rule ARCI 008-010 (Z);

Any person mounted on a horse or stable pony on association grounds must wear a properly secured safety helmet at all times. Additionally, all members of the starting gate crew must adhere to this regulation at all times while performing their duties or handling a horse. A member of the starting crew means any person licensed as an assistant starter or any person who handles a horse in the starting gate.

Safety Vest Guidelines

Per ARCI Model Rule ARCI 008-010 (Z);

Any person mounted on a horse or stable pony on the association grounds must wear a properly-secured safety vest at all times. Additionally, all members of the starting gate crew must also adhere to this regulation at all times while performing their duties or handling a horse. A member of the starting gate crew means any person licensed as an assistant starter or any person who handles a horse at the starting gate.

For additional information regarding safety helmets, safety vests and additional safety equipment, including the required minimum standards for each, please reference ARCI Model Rule 008-010 (Z) 1-4.

Riding Crops & Other Racing Equipment

In accordance with Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7883.0170:

- 1. No bridle shall weigh more than two pounds.
- 2. All riding crops are subject to inspection and approval by the Stewards and the Clerk of Scales and shall fall under the specifications as provided within Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7883.0170.

Toe Grabs

Toe grabs other than wear plates with a height greater than two millimeters (.07874 inches), including bends, jar caulks, stickers and any other traction device worn on the front of shoes of horses while racing or training on all racing surfaces are prohibited.

Safety Notification Information

Canterbury Park is committed to providing a safe environment. If you have any concerns, please contact the HBPA's Office or Canterbury's Risk Management staff.

Minnesota Racing Commission Claiming Procedures

1. Horse Owners with a Horse on the Grounds

A licensed horse owner who is registered to participate at the race meeting and who has a horse on the grounds may make a claim for a horse without obtaining a Claim Certificate. Such an owner has to be a qualified horse owner both by the Minnesota Racing Commission and the racing association.

2. Licensed Horse Owners

An individual who has a valid license as a horse owner - even though he or she may not at the present time actually own a race horse registered to race - may request a Claim Certificate from the Stewards which will authorize a claim. The Stewards will review the individual's qualifications, determine whether or not the individual has made proper arrangements with a licensed trainer for the care of any claimed horse and will issue a Claim Certificate when satisfied that the owner meets all claiming qualifications.

3. Unlicensed Individuals

An individual who desires to become an owner of a race horse through claiming may request a Claim Certificate from the Stewards by the following method: Submit a completed application for horse owner's license to the Minnesota Racing Commission at the meeting where the claim will be made. The application must indicate the breed of the horse to be claimed and must state "to be claimed". The application must have the name of a licensed trainer who will be responsible for the care of the claimed horse. In addition to the application, a completed fingerprint card and a check or money order for the license are required.

Restrictions on Claimed Horses

- 1. Claims shall be made in writing on a form provided by the association. Claims shall be signed and sealed in an envelope provided by the association, and that envelope must be submitted and time stamped by the association not less then 15 minutes prior to post time of the race in which the horse to be claimed is entered.
- 2. A successful claimant may not transfer or sell a horse he has claimed (for racing purposes) for a period of 30 days. The racing association may demand that the horse be removed from the grounds and the association is not obligated to continue to provide such horse stall space on its grounds.
- 3. Claimed horses shall race at track claimed. No claimed horse shall race at any other racetrack until after the close of the meeting at which it was claimed, or for 60 days, whichever is shorter, except to fulfill one or more stakes engagements.
- 4. A Claim Certificate is valid only at the race meeting where issued and is valid for the term indicated on the Certificate by the Stewards.
- 5. Horses must be claimed in accordance with full registered ownership. If there are two or more owners of a horse through which a claim is made, all must be included in the claim and so recorded thereon.
- 6. Determination of the true sex of a claimed horse shall be the sole responsibility of the claimant and mistakes in that regard printed in the official program or elsewhere shall not be considered basis for invalidating the claim.
- 7. Claimed horses may run back for any claiming price in their next start.
- All claimed horses will be subject to drug testing by the Minnesota Racing Commission.

Minnesota Racing Commission Licensing

Applications for annual occupation licenses shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee according to the following schedule:

- 1. \$100 Veterinarian, bloodstock agent or vendor
- 2. \$50 Owner, trainer, farrier or partnership
- 3. \$35 Jockey, apprentice jockey or jockey agent
- 4. \$20 Exercise person or assistant trainer
- 5. \$15 Pony person
- 6. \$10 Hot walker or groom

Minnesota rule requires all applicants who have not previously been licensed by the commission to submit fingerprints with their initial application.

All applicants previously licensed by the commission must submit fingerprints or proof of fingerprinting from an approved jurisdiction every 60 months.

Trainer Employee Lists

Trainers are responsible for seeing that all their employees hold valid Minnesota Racing Commission licenses. Under the rules and regulations of the Minnesota Racing Commission, all participants in racing - officials, owners, trainers, jockeys, stable hands, etc, as well as pari-mutuel operators - are required to be licensed to serve in their respective capacities.

Each trainer must provide a list of all persons in his or her employment to the association's Security Office and must ensure that those persons are licensed by the Commission no later than the next racing day after those employees arrive on the grounds of an association. Lists will be available at the stable gate. Trainers are required to keep these lists current. Upon discharge of an employee, the trainer shall report that fact to the association's Security Office by no later than the end of that racing day.

Worker's Compensation

All horsemen racing at Canterbury Park are required to have a valid certificate of insurance for worker's compensation covering stable employees. This includes exercise riders that are not independent contractors. If they are deemed independent contractors they must meet the requirements set by MN statute 5224.0330 and 5224.0340

Pony Rider & Groom Attire

All pony riders must wear approved jackets or shirts while on the racetrack during racing hours. These items will be available for purchase in the Racing Office.

Pony riders will be expected to keep their mounts well groomed and their tack clean.

Grooms will be provided with numbered vests which they must wear when with their horse in the paddock and the walking ring.

Juveniles in the Canterbury Park Stable Area

- 1. All people under the age of 18 who do not hold a current Minnesota Racing Commission (MRC) License, and are employed in the Stable Area or are not signed in by a legal parent or guardian through the Stable Gate Visitors Log, must obtain a dependent's credential from the Security Department. In order to obtain the dependent credentials, a parent or legal guardian must accompany the dependent and sign for the credential, whereby the parent or legal guardian would accept full responsibility for the dependent, relative to the rules set forth by the MRC and policies set forth by Canterbury Park.
- 2. The Security Department will identify people under the age of 18 or people who do not hold a current MRC license, who are believed to be employed in the Stable Area, and report the findings to the MRC.
- 3. People under the age of 16 will not be allowed to operate any motor vehicle on Canterbury Park property.
- 4. Substantial penalties will be levied against any MRC Licensee who employs a person under the age of 16 or who employs people without a valid MRC License.
- Substantial penalties will be levied against any parent or legal guardian who, after an investigative process, has been determined to be neglectful of said dependent.

Dogs in the Stable Area

No dogs will be allowed overnight in the stable area and dogs are forbidden from Canterbury Park's dormitories.

Unlicensed Employees in the Stable Area

Any owner or trainer employing unlicensed individuals will be held completely responsible for all medical bills incurred by such help as a result of an accident at Canterbury Park.

Any owner or trainer employing unlicensed help is subject to disciplinary action by the Stewards.

Parking in the Stable Area

Individuals that receive parking tickets, and moving violation(s) on the grounds of Canterbury Park maybe subject to the temporary or permanent forfeiture of driving privileges in the Stable Area.

All licensed persons wishing to operate a motor vehicle in the Stable Area:

- 1. Must obtain, from the Stable Gate, a parking permit that must be visible at all times from outside of the vehicle.
- 2.All persons operating motor vehicles on the grounds of Canterbury Park are required to hold a valid driver's license and proof of insurance.

House Rules & General Rules of Occupancy

Each year, several items are regulated by House Rule. Copies of each House Rule can be obtained from the Steward's Office or the Racing Secretary's Office.

Exclusive Rights Vested in Canterbury Park

Canterbury Park Holding Corporation reserves for itself the exclusive right and sole discretion to enter, modify, alter or change the physical condition or use of any of its facilities, wherever located on or about its premises; and permission granted herein to the Licensee to use the premises does not constitute a lease of the premises and Canterbury Park maintains the sole interest in and exclusive control of the premises.

Applicable Rules & Regulations

The license and privilege to reside at Canterbury Park granted hereunder is subject to and shall be governed by the conditions, rules and regulations of Canterbury Park as contained in the Dormitory Agreement and as set forth in its House Rules, Condition Books, Overnight Sheets or other materials published and disseminated by Canterbury Park, or posted in its Racing Secretary's Office, Horsemen's Office or in any other Canterbury Park publication. Rules and Regulations are subject to change from time to time and any changes shall be deemed effective when made.

Dormitory Revocation

Residency in a dormitory room at Canterbury Park is **a revocable privilege** at the sole and exclusive discretion of Canterbury Park. Revocation of Dormitory Privileges may also include exclusion from all Canterbury Park property.

Dormitory Inspections

As a means of insuring a safe environment within the stable area, periodic inspections will be conducted by track personnel of dormitory rooms at Canterbury Park. Failure to cooperate with a dormitory room inspection may be cause for immediate revocation of dormitory room privileges.

Fire Safety

The Licensee entering upon this agreement acknowledges having read and understood the Fire Prevention Regulations of Canterbury Park. Failure to follow the regulations or to allow any safety inspection may be cause for immediate revocation of the licensee's dormitory room. Upon the request of the Shakopee City Fire Marshall, any dormitory or building on Canterbury Park property may be inspected. All city and state electrical codes must be followed at all times.

Notice Regarding Bulk Shavings

Training Schedules and Regulations

The track will be open for training beginning April 25, weather permitting. Training hours will be 6 a.m. - 10 a.m. daily with one break from 8 a.m. - 8:30 a.m.

Any person mounted on a horse or working as a member of the starting gate crew must wear both a securely fastened safety helmet and safety vest on the race track. See subsection of this Condition Book entitled Minnesota Racing Commission Safety Rules for more information.

Horses galloping on the track at less than a two-minute clip will be required to stay 25 feet from the inside rail.

An ambulance staffed with an EMT as well as a horse ambulance will be available during training hours.

There will be outriders on the track for your protection. <u>Please, do not hesitate to call the outrider if you need assistance.</u>

Starting Gate Schooling

The starting gate is available for schooling each morning during workouts. Schooling hours to be announced.

Paddock Schooling

Permission to school in the paddock must be obtained from the Paddock Judge. The Paddock Judge can be reached through the Racing Office.

Paddock Entrance

Paddock entrance is restricted to owners, trainers, and their employees and those involved with the conduct of racing at Canterbury Park. Any others wishing access or entrance to the Paddock area must receive prior approval from the Racing Secretary, Stewards, or Canterbury management. No food, drink or strollers are permitted in the paddock at any time.

Stall Cleaning

Trainers are asked to make sure that the stalls allotted to them for the meet are clean upon vacating the backside at the end of season.

A fee will be charged for stalls not stripped.

Change of Equipment & Gate Card

All trainers who request a change of blinkers must first secure a card from the starter.

A change of blinker equipment must be reported to the Racing Secretary's office at time of entry.

All horses which have never started must have approval from the starter before entry will be accepted.

All horses must carry their equipment to the post.
