# Canterbury Park Entertainment, LLC Terms and Conditions

The undersigned, individually and on behalf of each owner of the horses listed on the front page of this document, and in order to induce Canterbury Park Entertainment, LLC (CPE) to accept this Agreement and to grant Applicant use of stall space and facilities, hereby warrants, covenants and agrees with CPE as follows:

- Applicant is the owner, or is authorized to act for and on behalf of each owner, of the horses listed on this stall application. Applicant shall comply with and
  fulfill all conditions necessary for Applicant to apply for and be allotted stall space and the use of CPE facilities, including but not limited to the grandstand,
  clubhouse, administrative offices, parking areas, backside, barns, stalls, racing surfaces and other portions of the grounds.
- 2. This agreement is a revocable license issued by CPE to Applicant. CPE specifically reserves the right (a) to revoke this license, with or without cause, and/or (b) to refuse Applicant entry in any race for any reason or cause without prior notice to Applicant.
- 3. Applicant shall abide by all rules and regulations of the Minnesota Racing Commission (MRC) and CPE, including, but not limited to, all provisions of this agreement. Applicant shall abide by all decisions of the MRC, Stewards and/or CPE with regard to disputes, claims and objections on all matters pertaining to racing and this Agreement, and Applicant shall accept such decisions as final.
- 4. Smoking is prohibited in all barn and stall areas. The use of any appliance with an exposed heating element is also prohibited in the dorm rooms.
- 5. Applicant and each of his/her employees, exercise riders and jockeys shall be duly licensed by the MRC and shall possess on their person at all times while on CPE's premises a valid picture license issued by the MRC.
- 6. Owners, trainers and stable help shall park only in those areas designated by CPE. Violators are subject to the revocation of driving privileges on the premises.
- 7. Horses may occupy only those stalls assigned to Applicant. Any horse found in an unassigned stall or in a stall assigned to another owner or trainer will be removed from the premises at Applicant's expense.
- 8. <u>Due to issues with its disposal, straw bedding will not be allowed on the grounds in 2025. All stalls must be bedded with wood shavings or another approved material.</u> Furthermore, CPE reserves the right to charge, through the Horseperson's Bookkeeper, for any charges related to this policy, any payments associated with the failure to properly strip stalls at the conclusion of the meet, dorm room cleaning fees and deposits, key deposits and/or RV sites rented on CPE property.
- 9. All horses entering the premises must have had their Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and negative Coggins test emailed to mrcinfo@state.mn.us at least 48 hours prior to arrival. The CVI must have been issued within the past 5 days and a negative Coggins test certificate issued within the 12 months prior to September 20, 2025. All horses must be vaccinated against rhinopheumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4) and influenza no less than 14 days and no more than 180 days before entering the premises as indicated on this Application. Other vaccinations required for thoroughbreds by HISA include EEE/WEE/WNV/Tetanus and rabies no more than 12 months prior to arrival. Additionally, Applicant acknowledges that the MRC veterinary staff and CPE have the authority to mandate vaccines based on outbreaks or pandemics.
- 10. No dogs will be allowed overnight in the stable area during the 2025 Live Racing Season. Permission to bring dogs in the stable area will need to be requested through registration with the Stable Area Manager and can be rescinded at any time by CPE for any reason.

### The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority and the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit

- 11. HISA's Racetrack Safety Rules and Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) program are implemented at Canterbury Park.
- 12. All persons participating in thoroughbred racing at Canterbury Park are required to register as a Covered Person with The Horseracing Integrity & Safety Authority (HISA). All thoroughbred race horses are required to be registered as Covered Horses with HISA upon the date of their first timed and reported workout
- 13. CPE reserves the right to deny stall space to any individual who is currently under investigation by HISA and/or HIWU. CPE also reserves the right to deny stall space to any individual who has completed a HISA and/or HIWU suspension within one year prior to the start of the 2025 Live Racing Season.

## **Code of Conduct**

- 14. CPE requires its participants to adhere to its Humane Treatment Policy. Any owner or trainer stabled at CPE who knowingly, or without conducting proper due diligence, sells a horse for slaughter or improperly transports horses in their care will have his/her stalls permanently revoked.
- 15. Applicant acknowledges that CPE, as a condition of allocating stalls, implements and requires compliance with a formal Code of Conduct. CPE specifically reserves the right to revoke this license, either temporarily or permanently, for failure to comply with its Code of Conduct.

#### Workers' Compensation

16. Applicant must have on file with the MRC a valid Workman's Compensation Insurance certificate. Failure to do so will result in the removal of Applicant's horses from CPE property.

#### Investigative Release

17. Applicant understands that an investigative report may be made whereby information is obtained through personal interviews with third parties. This inquiry may include information as to the Applicant's character, general representation, personal characteristics and mode of living. The Applicant has the right to make written requests within a reasonable period of time for a complete and accurate disclosure of additional information concerning the nature and scope of the investigation

#### **CPE Release**

- 18. Applicant acknowledges that being granted stall space for his/her horses is a privilege. Applicant also acknowledges that stall space is allocated for those horses that are intended to race at CPE during the 2025 Live Racing Season. Participation of horses during the 2025 Live Racing Season will be reviewed and may positively or negatively impact Applicant's stall allocations during the current or future CPE Live Racing Seasons.
- 19. In consideration of participating in stabling, racing, training and other related activities at CPE, the Applicant gives consent to the collection and reporting of information into the Equine Injury Database (EID) by the Minnesota Racing Commission's (MRC) veterinary staff concerning any injury to or unsoundness of a horse owned or trained by the applicant which causes the horse to be placed on the MRC Veterinarian's list while on the grounds of CPE. The Applicant agrees to cooperate in the disclosure of such information to the extent that such cooperation is reasonably required to meet these reporting requirements. The Applicant covenants not to sue and to indemnify, release and hold harmless CPE, the MRC and any employees or agents acting on their behalf (the Indemnified Parties) from and against any liability, cost, loss or expense of any kind or nature (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from any claim, demand, or action (a) alleging that the data entered into the EID (either directly or indirectly) violates the rights of the applicant or any third party, or (b) relating to any equine injury report run, published or otherwise created by any of the Indemnified Parties (either directly or indirectly).
- 20. Applicant agrees that neither CPE, or its directors, employees or agents shall be liable for any loss, damage, death or injury of any kind to Applicant or to Applicant's employees, agents, invitees, exercise riders, jockeys or any member of their respective families, property or animals, regardless of whether such injury, loss, death or damage is caused by a condition of the facilities at CPE and/or any negligent act or omission of CPE, its officers, employees and agents from any other cause. Applicant hereto specifically and knowingly assumes all risks of such injury, loss, death or damage, fully and completely.
- 21. CPE may broadcast by television, radio, internet or other media transmission now known or hereafter disclosed, or authorize or license the aforementioned media of any and all horse racing activities on CPE premises. CPE hereby reserves all television, radio, internet and still photography rights with respect to any horse racing activity on the premises provided however that nothing contained herein is intended to affect those rights governed by the Interstate Horse Racing Act of 1978.
